 - (4) Guidance to principal investigators and other personnel involved in the care and use of animals regarding ... euthanasia.

The facility houses hamsters but they are not mentioned in the written program of veterinary care. Without this information we cannot be sure that the vivarium staff has an approved guide to follow regarding the preventative health care, emergency care, etc. of the animals. The written program should include all covered species with a complete description of the care animals will be provided with at the facility.

SANITATION.

(b) Housekeeping. Premises (buildings and grounds) shall be kept clean and in good repair in order to protect the animals from injury and to facilitate the prescribed husbandry practices set forth in this subpart. Premises shall remain free of accumulations of trash.

East facility - There is a moderate accumulation of trash in the vivarium and includes a broken light, a soiled bowl and plastic container, and a mild amount of bedding on the floor. Also, the floor in the animal room appears soiled. Premises (buildings and grounds) should be kept clean in order to protect the animals from injury and decrease the possibility of disease hazards. Accumulations of trash shall be placed in designated areas and cleared as necessary to protect the health of the animals.
