**INSTITUTIONAL ANIMAL CARE AND USE COMMITTEE (IACUC).**

(3) Prepare reports of its evaluations conducted as required by paragraphs (c)(1) and (2) of this section, and submit the reports to the Institutional Official of the research facility. The reports shall be reviewed and signed by a majority of the IACUC members and must include any minority views. The reports shall be updated at least once every six months upon completion of the required semiannual evaluations and shall be maintained by the research facility and made available to APHIS and to officials of funding Federal agencies for inspection and copying upon request. The reports must contain a description of the nature and extent of the research facility's adherence to this subchapter, must identify specifically any departures from the provisions of title 9, chapter I, subchapter A--Animal Welfare, and must state the reasons for each departure.

\*\*\*Currently the information regarding the minutes for the meetings and the individual facility inspections forms are maintained separately. They have not been compiled to produce the semi-annual report containing the total animal program review and the required signatures. There are no signatures. Semi-annual reports containing the information required in Section 2.31 (c)(1) and (c)(2) must be distributed as required and copies maintained for review during inspection.  
Correct by: The next semiannual inspection (November, 2005)

(e) A proposal to conduct an activity involving animals, or to make a significant change in an ongoing activity involving animals, must contain the following:

- (1) Identification of the species and the approximate number of animals to be used;
- (2) A rationale for involving animals, and for the appropriateness of the species and numbers of animals to be used;
- (3) A complete description of the proposed use of the animals;
- (4) A description of procedures designed to assure that discomfort and pain to animals will be limited to that which is unavoidable for the conduct of scientifically valuable research, including provision for the use of analgesic, anesthetic, and tranquilizing drugs where indicated and appropriate to minimize discomfort and pain to animals; and

- (5) A description of any euthanasia method to be used.
