**PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.**

(a)(2) (xi) Primary enclosures for dogs must provide sufficient space to allow each dog to turn about freely, to stand, sit, and lie in a comfortable, normal position, and to walk in a normal manner. I observed one dog in the small animal clinic demonstration holding area that was in a cage that was not tall enough to allow him to stand without holding his head down. This can cause unnecessary stress to the animal. All dogs shall be maintained in enclosures providing adequate space to allow normal postural adjustments. Correct by end of inspection.

**FACILITIES, GENERAL.**

(c) Storage. Supplies of food and bedding shall be stored in facilities which adequately protect such supplies against deterioration, molding, or contamination by vermin. Refrigeration shall be provided for supplies of perishable food.

\*\*\*The hay and bedding barn is in severe disrepair. There are three walls all of which have panels that are falling off. There is a support post that has been damaged by a trailer. This post has separated and is no longer supporting the roof which is causing the roof to sag. The tin roof has panels missing leaving the hay and bedding exposed to rain. Bedding and food supplies shall be stored in a manner that protects them from contamination thereby safeguarding the health and well being of the animals they are used on.
