INDOOR HOUSING FACILITIES.

The floors and walls of indoor housing facilities and any other surface that comes in contact with the dogs must be impervious to moisture. During the routine inspection with management, it was noted that the floors and walls of six dog in six different dog primary enclosures contained surface areas that are not impervious to moisture. These areas were shown to management and must be corrected to comply with AWA regulations.

ENVIRONMENT ENHANCEMENT TO PROMOTE PSYCHOLOGICAL WELL-BEING.

Research facilities must develop, document and follow an appropriate plan for environment enhancement adequate to promote the psychological well-being of nonhuman primates. During the routine inspection with management, it was noted that the primate enrichment plan was not properly documented when examining the enrichment records. This noncompliant item was pointed out to management and explained that research facilities must document the enrichment plan for environment enhancement for promoting the psychological well-being of the nonhuman primates.

CLEANING, SANITIZATION, HOUSEKEEPING, AND PEST CONTROL.

Premises where housing facilities are located, including buildings and surrounding grounds, must be kept clean and in good repair in order to protect the nonhuman primates from injury, and to facilitate the husbandry practices required in this subpart. During the routine inspection with management, it was noted that the vents/fans needed cleaning and flaking paint of the overhead ceiling needed to be repaired. These noncompliant items were pointed out and explained to management the need for compliance to facilitate good husbandry practices.
