If the lost tag is not located, the research facility shall affix another official tag to the animal in the manner prescribed in this section and record the tag number on the official records.

FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Disposal facilities shall be so provided and operated as to minimize odors and disease hazards.

There is a large amount of water with fecal material accumulating outside the rabbit building due to a pump that is not working properly. This standing sewage is creating an odor and is a disease hazard. The pump needs to function to prevent standing water and sewage from accumulation.

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

Primary enclosures shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury.

There are several cages on each row which need to be repaired or replaced due to broken wires or rusting cage wires. These areas are weak and may result in injury to the animal if they break completely. Cages need to be maintained on a regular schedule and replaced as needed.

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Enclosure shall be kept reasonably free of excreta and hair. Troughs or pans under enclosures shall be cleaned at least once each week.

The trays of the rabbit cages in the quarantine area are stained with urine scale and need more frequent cleaning . Matted hair and feces are accumulating on the floors of several enclosures in the main rabbit room and there is accumulation of debris on the drain boards under several enclosures.Cleaning of enclosures, trays and drain boards needs to occur on a more frequent schedule to prevent hair and debris buildup and maintain husbandry practices.
