INSTITUTIONAL ANIMAL CARE AND USE COMMITTEE (IACUC).**

d) IACUC review of activities involving animals.

(1) In order to approve proposed activities or proposed significant changes in ongoing activities, the IACUC shall conduct a review of those components of the activities related to the care and use of animals and determine that the proposed activities are in accordance with this subchapter unless acceptable justification for a departure is presented in writing;

Antibody production was started in the goats in the summer of 2006 ,however the protocol has still not been approved by the IACUC. All protocols must be in place and approved by the IACUC prior to the use of covered species.

**2.33 (b) (2) REPEAT NCI DIRECT
ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE.**

(b) Each research facility shall establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care that include:

- (1) The availability of appropriate facilities, personnel, equipment, and services to comply with the provisions of this subchapter;
- (2) The use of appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries, and the availability of emergency, weekend, and holiday care;

Once again there is a rabbit exhibiting signs of wry neck. This rabbit's head is twisted to the side. Rabbits with wry neck have a hard time maintaining normal body posture. The water lixits in the cage are at the top of the cage. Rabbits must stand tall to gain access to water. This would be very difficult for a rabbit with wry neck to gain easy access to the water. An easily accessible water supply (such as bottles or bowls) must be provided to rabbits that show signs of wry neck.

Correct Immediately

The facility and the attending veterinarian need to develop an SOP concerning the care and treatment for rabbits with wry neck to assure that rabbits with wry neck are provided adequate vet care and treatment. Correct By : 4-10-07

c) Storage. Supplies of food and bedding shall be stored in facilities which adequately protect such supplies against infestation or contamination by vermin. Refrigeration shall be provided for supplies of perishable food.

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There is standing water on the floor directly under the pallets used to store the bags of rabbit feed. At time of inspection , the feed bags were dry but standing water directly under feed sacks may dampen the bags causing deterioration of the feed. Recent hard rains have caused water to seep into this room . Standing water must be prevented from the food storage room to prevent contamination of feed supplies. Correct By : 4-30-07
