3.1 (c X 3) REPEAT NCI DIRECT
HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Hard surfaces with which the dogs come in contact must be spot cleaned daily and sanitized in accordance with section 3.11 (b) of the subpart to prevent accumulation of excreta and reduce the disease hazards. It was noted that the chain link fence gates in several rooms of the facility contained dried excreta. This noncompliant item was discussed and explained to management the importance of sanitation to prevent accumulation of excreta on contact hard surfaces and reduction of disease hazards. The chain link fence gates need to be cleaned.

3.6 (a X 2 X ii) REPEAT NCI DIRECT
PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

Primary enclosures must protect the dogs from injury. It was noted during the routine inspection, the primary enclosure housing one dog contained a chain link fence with a large opening. It was noticed that the dog protruded its head out through the opening. It was discussed and explained to management that the opening in the fence predisposes the dog to injury. The chain link fence needs to be repaired or replaced to prevent injury to the dog.

3.9 (b) DIRECT
FEEDING.

Food receptacles must be used for dogs and cats, must be readily accessible to all dogs and cats, and must be located so as to minimize contamination by excreta. If the food receptacles are not disposable, they must be kept clean and must be sanitized in accordance with 3.11 (b) of this subpart. It was noted during routine inspection, an employees' cleaning procedure of a food receptacle contaminated with feces. The employee simply rinse the container with water. It was explained to me that the receptacles are daily rinsed with water prior to feeding. The procedure of rinsing the receptacle with water is acceptable as long as the receptacles are not contaminated with feces. It was discussed and explained to management the need for proper training of its employees.
