Each research facility shall employ an attending veterinarian under formal arrangements. In the case of part-time attending veterinarian or consultant arrangements, the formal arrangements shall include a written program of veterinary care and regularly scheduled visits to the research facility. It was noted during routine inspection that the research facility did no longer have a full time AV. It was explained and discussed with management that their part-time AV or consultant arrangement requires that a written PVC with regularly schedule visits to the facility needed to be completed.

HOUSING FACILITIES, GENERAL.

Indoor housing facilities for dogs and cats must be sufficiently ventilated at all times when dogs and cats are present to provide for their health and to minimize odor and ammonia levels. It was noted that a room on second floor housing approximately ten dogs contained a strong ammonia odor which affected my eyes during the time inspecting that room. The strong ammonia odor was probably due to the urine observed on the floor in front of several dog cages. It was explained and discussed with management that eventhough, the room appeared reasonably cleaned that it is a necessity to clean the floors on regularly basis because the dogs are urinating onto the floor.

PRIMARY ENCLOSURES.

Primary enclosures must protect the dogs from injury. It was noted during the routine inspection, a primary enclosure housing one dog on the first floor contained a chain link fence with a large opening. Another primary enclosure on the second floor housing a dog contained a broken rod which enabled the dog to protrude it head out of the cage. It was discussed and explained to management that these openings in the primary enclosures predisposes the dogs to injury. Management contacted me the following day to informed me that both noncompliances were corrected.

The last routine inspection and exit review were conducted on 05/23/06. This routine inspection and exit review were conducted with management and USDA VMO, Earnest Johnson.
